Subject: - Grant of Yearly Permission to Shiva Ayurvedic Medical College and Hospital, Village Luhanu Kanetain, P.O. Chandpur Tehsil Sadar, Distt. Bilaspur, Himachal Pradesh-174004 (Inst. ID-AYU0380) with an intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course & in 03 PG courses with 14 seats (instead of 15 seats) in the subject namely (i) Kriya Sharir- 05 seats (ii) Ayurved Samhita, Sanskrit & Siddhanta- 04 seats (instead of 05 seats) and (iii) Rasa Shastra & Bhaisajya Kalpana- 05 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26-reg.

Sir/Madam,

- 1) To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely **Shiva Ayurvedic Medical College and Hospital, Village Luhanu Kanetain, P.O. Chandpur Tehsil Sadar, Distt. Bilaspur, Himachal Pradesh-174004 (Inst. ID-AYU0380)** inspection was conducted on **20.03.2025 and 21.03.2025 in hybrid mode** as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the **yearly permission with an intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and in 03 PG courses with 15 seats in the subject namely (i) Kriya Sharir-05 seats (ii) Ayurved Samhita, Sanskrit & Siddhanta - 05 seats and (iii) Rasa Shastra & Bhaisajya Kalpana - 05 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.**
- 2) The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of the enforced regulations, namely, "Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in the NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024, NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations, 2024 and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations there under. **On careful examination of the assessment report and as per the Visitor Observation following shortcomings/defects have been observed:-**

1. Teaching staffs:-

a) Availability of total teaching staff for UG (BAMS) Course considering above faculty submitted by the college is $\frac{\text{Available}}{\text{Required}} \times 100\% = \frac{28}{30} \times 100\% = 93.3\%$ (Excluding Excess)

- 5) The submission made by the college during clarification and assessment report have been carefully examined in terms of the concerned Acts & Regulations and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder and as per the direction of the competent authority the assessment report along with clarification report was once again placed in the **134th Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on **16.07.2025**. On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein as mentioned above the college was given an opportunity of virtual hearing vide the MARBISM letter (Hearing notice) of **even no. dated 23.07.2025** to appear on **25.07.2025** before the designated Hearing Committee to present their case and to show cause as to **why not the yearly permission to your college for the academic session 2025-26, be denied.**
- 6) The college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated above. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions **vide letter. ref. no. SAMCH/BLP/BAMS/EST-1400/25 dated 24.07.2025** against the deficiencies conveyed to them. Whereas, the college through its representatives, **Meeting was attended by Dr. Harsha NM, Principal of the college, Dr. Anup Kumar, Vice Principal**, appeared before the Hearing Committee on **25.07.2025** and made their submission virtually as well as written submission against the shortcomings communicated

to the college. The shortcomings communicated to the college, submission made by the representatives of the Ayurveda college and observations made by the Hearing Committee are as under:-

Both are working full time and their cumulative attendance on AEBAS portal has been 86.82% and 70.54% respectively.</p> <p>iii. Prof. Upendernath Sharma (AYRS00288) is working as Professor in the department of RachanaSharir on regular basis since 01.02.2025 and his cumulative attendance till date has been 72.09% which is available on AEBAS portal. It is important to convey at this juncture that Dr. Upendernath Sharma was on leave for nine days in the month of February soon after joining owing to unfortunate demise of his mother. The relevant documents are available with the institute.</p> <p>iv. Dr. Kuldeep Singh: We have had no teacher working in the name of Dr. Kuldeep Singh. However, one teacher by name Dr. Kuldeep (AYKC02442) is working in the capacity of Associate Professor in the department of Kayachikitsa since 09.12.2024 who is also a regular teaching staff with a cumulative attendance of 87.60% on AEBAS portal.</p> <p>v. Dr. Deepshikha (AYSTO0397) was a Professor in the department of Shalyatantra who has been relieved on 20.01.2025 following her resignation.</p> <p>vi. Dr. Deelip Sharma: As per our records, there has not been any teacher by name Deelip Sharma. However, there was one Dr. Dalip Sharma (AYRNO0389) working as Professor in the department of Roganidana and he has been relieved on 28.02.2025 after attainment of superannuation.</p> <p>vii. Dr. Vinod: Actually, we had a teacher by name Prof. Vinod Kumar (AYKB00347) working as Professor in the department of Kaumarabhritya who has also been relieved owing to superannuation on 29.03.2025.</p> <p>viii. Dr. Rajesh Sood (AYSS00687) has been appointed on 04.12.2024 as Professor in the department of Ayurveda Samhita & Siddhanta and he has been a full time regular teacher. 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- 7) The observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report of the NCISM have been carefully re-examined in terms of the concerned Acts & Regulations and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder and as per the direction of the competent authority the recommendation of Hearing Committee was placed in the **137th Board meeting** of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) **held on 30.07.2025 and Board concluded that the college is not fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of yearly permission under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 but fulfilling the requisite criteria as per Board's policy letter issued on 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025 in UG (BAMS) course and in 02 PG courses with 10 seats in the subject namely (i) Kriya Sharir- 05 seats and (ii) Rasa Shastra & Bhaisajya Kalpana- 05 seats and not fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of permission in 01 PG courses with 05 seats in the subject namely (i) Ayurved Samhita, Sanskrit & Siddhanta under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26 due to non availability of required teaching staff as PG regulation. However, Board decided to issue yearly permission in Ayurved Samhita, Sanskrit & Siddhanta as per the teacher student ratio.**

For PG Course:-

In the Department of Ayurved Samhita, Sanskrit & Siddhanta -College is having total 06 eligible teaching faculties 01 professor for UG & 03 assistant professor for UG and 01 assistant professor for PG and there is shortcoming of 01 associate Professor for PG. *Further, only 01 Assistant Professor is having more than 05 years of teaching experience and eligible for guideship as per the concerned Regulation.* As per the available teaching faculties, college is not fulfilling the teacher student ratio as per the submitted seats in Part-1 and **eligible for issuance of permission for only 04 seats instead 05 seats.**

- 8) **Accordingly, college is fulfilling the basic eligibility criteria for issuance of yearly permission with an intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course & in 03 PG courses with 14 seats (instead of 15 seats) in the subject namely (i) Kriya Sharir-05 seats (ii) Ayurved Samhita, Sanskrit & Siddhanta - 04 seats (instead of 05 seats) and (iii) Rasa Shastra & Bhaisajya Kalpana - 05 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.**

"DECISION"

- 9) **Therefore, in view of shortcomings and deficiencies mentioned as above in accordance with Regulation 54 (3) of MESAR UG Ayurveda 2024, Regulation 15 (5) of MESAR PG 2024 , Policy letter dated 09.01.2025 and 20.01.2025 Shiva Ayurvedic Medical College and Hospital, Village Luhanu Kanetain, P.O. Chandpur Tehsil Sadar, Distt. Bilaspur, Himachal Pradesh-174004 (Inst. ID-AYU0380) is hereby granted with an intake capacity of 60 seats in UG (BAMS) course and in 03 PG courses with 14 seats (instead of 15 seats) in the subject namely (i) Kriya Sharir- 05 seats, (ii) Ayurved Samhita, Sanskrit & Siddhanta - 04 seats (instead of 05 seats) and (iii) Rasa Shastra & Bhaisajya Kalpana - 05 seats under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020, for the academic session 2025-26 subject to the condition that aforementioned shortcomings shall be fulfilled along with the following conditions:-**

I. It is further informed that minimum **15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 60 seats and 15% of postgraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 14 seats (instead of 15 seats) in 03 PG courses** shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. **The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.**

II. Determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated

- 10) Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 11) Further, **as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020**, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then **in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.**
- 12) Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.
- 13) **Compliance of all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the Implementation letters vide. ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS. Dated 09.05.2024 & 06.09.2024 issued by the Board.**
- 14) **The following requirements must be fulfilled and the compliance report must reach the Board by 31st December, 2025 to be considered for the issuance of permission for the academic session 2026-2027:-**
- All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder should be fulfilled.
 - All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
 - All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM (Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Postgraduate Institutions and Minimum Standards for Postgraduate Education in Ayurveda) Regulations, 2024.
 - The remaining shortcomings mentioned in Para no. 6 above, shall be fulfilled.**
- 15) The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2026-27.
